## PYFA Winter Convention February 5-7, 2019

#### 2019 NYFEA INSTITUTE – IN PENNSYLVANIA!

To our fellow Pennsylvania Young Farmer members,

We are about one year out from hosting the National Young Farmers Education Association (NYFEA) Annual Institute. Hosting this event requires a huge commitment of time, talent, and energy that will be needed in order for us to truly be "Pennsylvania Proud", which is the theme of our event. The venue

that was selected is the Lancaster Marriott at Penn Square, in downtown Lancaster. The Institute will officially begin on Wednesday, December 11, 2019 and conclude Saturday evening, December 14th with the banquet.



Here is a brief overview of what our schedule looks like:

**TUESDAY** Key committee members arrive to start setting up. Final coordinators meeting in the evening.

**WEDNESDAY** Registration begins, NYFEA Board Meeting, Delegates Meeting, Advisors Meeting, ending with the Taste of PA Reception (will need all chapters to participate).

**THURSDAY** Tour to Chester County to include mushroom houses, URBN retail distribution center, Herr's Snack Factory, Herr Angus Farm, and Longwood Gardens. (Attendees will choose from multiple tour options). Dinner will be at one of Lancaster's many smörgåsbord restaurants. We are also looking at including the Christmas show at American Music Theatre before heading back to the hotel.

**FRIDAY** The tours, for this day, will be centered in Lancaster County. Again, there will be an option to choose the tour you wish to go on. Options will include Liberation Tiny Homes, Oregon Dairy Organics/Compost Facility, CASE NH, Kreider Farms, and Kitchen Kettle Village. We will have a few stops in the Lititz area such as Sturgis Pretzels, Wilbur Chocolates, Outback Toy Store, and Elva Hurst Chalk Talk. We are hoping to find a unique venue to host our evening dinner with entertainment.

**SATURDAY** Our exhibitors will be set up as we will be at the Marriott throughout the day. NYFEA will host an Ag Decision Makers College, featuring a panel of industry professionals, where agricultural issues will be discussed. The Ag Communications and Young Ag Leaders event will also take place on Saturday. This is a great opportunity for the next generation of agricultural leaders to participate. We are looking at making this event one that our young adult attendees will find to be very valuable. Past participants of this event are encouraged to participate and to help the national association in implementing the program. Lunch and dinner will include presentations and recognition of NYFEA leaders and we will recognize leaders of PA agriculture.
